



## **Waterfront Toronto Preliminary Human Rights Assessment of the Amended Master Innovation and Development Plan**

### **Team Description:**

The Preliminary Human Rights Impact Assessment of the Sidewalk Labs amended Master Innovation and Development Plan will be led by Element AI, a world-leading provider of artificial intelligence solutions, supported by a consortium of bid partners with complementary expertise.
